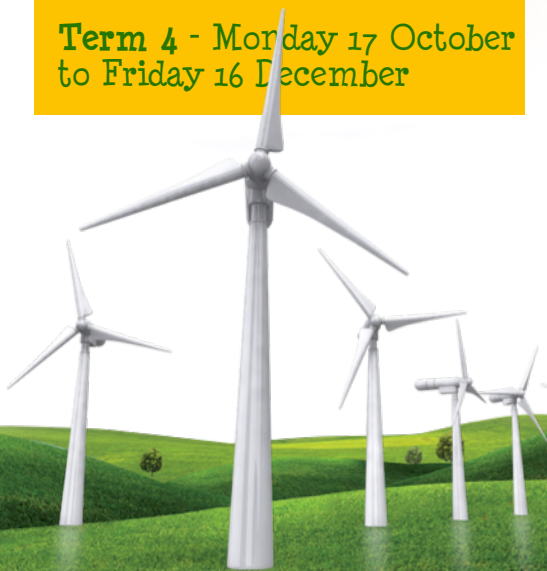
New Deputy Principal Appointment:

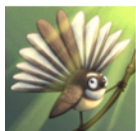
