KIWI CLASS FILLING THEIR BUCKETS

Kiwi class have been learning about filling our own and other's "buckets". We read the book "How full is your bucket?" by Tom Rath and Mary Reckmeyer, in which a boy learns that everyone has invisible buckets above them than can either be emptied or filled. The emptier the buckets are, the more negative the person feels. The more filled, the more positive. When your bucket is empty, it's difficult to then fill the buckets of others, but if your bucket is full, you can share yours with others to help their buckets get full too, and by filling other's buckets, you fill your own. It's been a good metaphor to help us learn about being kind and respectful to others, and that doing so makes us feel good too.
